#### From the Head Table

August is an appropriate month for us, Indians, to thank the nation for being a real mother to her citizens, and it is also a time to think about our loyalty towards our motherland. The freedom and dignity that we enjoy today are the results of the martyrdom and sacrifice of our forefathers, who led this great nation from the dark ages of slavery to a new era of hope and self-governance. Every citizen who is loyal to his or her country has to 'ask not what your country



can do for you - ask what you can do for your country' (John F. Kennedy, 1961 Presidential Inauguration Address). The right attitude of a citizen is, according to the Book of Samuel, as follows: "But Ittai answered the king, 'As the Lord lives, and as my lord, the king lives, wherever my lord the king may be, whether for death or life, there also your servant will be" (2 Samuel 15: 21).

'Being loyal' to a nation is to cherish the values enshrined in the constitution of the country. The Preamble of the Indian Constitution posits its main values: liberty, equality, fraternity, justice, sovereignty, socialism, secularism, democracy, human dignity, unity and integrity of the Nation. Every citizen of this great nation has to defend and safeguard these values. It is all the more important these days when the voice of dissent is seen as 'treason against the country' or 'threat to national security, and those citizens are put behind the bar. Stanislaus Lourduswamy aka Stan Swamy, an octogenarian tribal rights activist, lost his life while in custody, and it is widely condemned as an injustice done to him in denying his basic rights as he was suffering from Parkinson's disease.

"Loyalty can never be imposed by force, fear, insecurity or intimidation" (Paulo Coelho). We should ensure that the 'loyalty' of a citizen is not misunderstood as slavery or as merely saying 'amen' to the diktats of politicians. Instead, we need to conscientize our fellow citizens that being loyal means the freedom to express one's opinions. It is in this context we have to recall the words of the great soul, Rabindranath Tagore, in his magnum opus, Gitanjali:

Where the mind is without fear and the head is held high;

Where knowledge is free...

Where the mind is led forward by thee into ever-widening thought and action;

Into that heaven of freedom, my Father, let my country awake,

As the shepherd woman rushed to save the cow, she was electrocuted and died instantly. Her dog, which saw the incident, barked and chased the other cows, to prevent them from reaching the same place to save them. Following the relatives' tears at the corpse of the woman, the dog also expressed its grief with them. It is one of the most inspiring and heart-warming instances of loyalty I have ever read. As we approach that momentous day, my mind recalls Subhash Chandra Bose's inspiring words: "Give me blood, and I'll give you independence." How devoted to his country was he! The freedom warriors who valiantly battled and gave their lives for the sake of our country's independence inspire in us a deep desire to remain loyal to the country till our last breath.

To cap it all, Mark Twain's words tug at my heartstrings: "Loyalty to the nation all the time, loyalty to the government when it deserves it." Although we must stay loyal to our country till death do us apart, we must raise our voices against injustice, corruption, and the government's self-serving acts. This year marks the 75th anniversary of our freedom. The question is: Are we truly free?




